Reading



- Reading is a huge focus in school. It enables all children to access their learning but can also inspire their writing and extend their vocabulary.
- In year 2, we will listen to your child read every week. Spotlight children will be heard more frequently. Children will bring a book home matched to their reading level and a reading record for you to sign when they have been heard at home.
- On a Thursday afternoon at 3pm come and join us for a story session in the library.



Phonics



Phonics will remain a focus and children will all remain on the RWI programme until at least next half term.

Children who need extra support with their phonics will also have the opportunity for extra phonics booster classes during the day and may be sent home with sounds or words to practise at home.

We hope you can join us for the Phonics meeting on 26th September at 9AM.



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Assessments



SATs

Although SATs remain statutory for Year 6, this is now not the case in Year 2.

As they are useful to provide an end of key stage assessment point, we will be completing the SATs tests during May 2024.

The statutory phonics check will be completed in June for those children who did not meet the expected standard in Year 1.



Homework



Each child will be provided with an English and Maths homework journal. Each week your child will have;

- 8 spellings to learn. 6 will be a spelling rule from The National Curriculum and 2 will be year 2 common exception words.
- One piece of English homework and this may be a reading comprehension or a writing task.
- One piece of maths work
- Occasionally, there will be an extra piece that relates to one of the foundation subjects.

Watch out parents as there may be something for you to do!



How can you help?



- Listen to your child read daily where possible
- Support them to learn their common exception words and speed sounds
- Support them to learn their spellings and complete their

homework




