MATHS

Next half term our Maths learning focus will be:

- Joining in with number and finger rhymes
- Opportunities through continuous provision and sensory play
- Touch counting objects in a regular pattern
- Understanding representations of number up to 10, (including Numicon, 10 frames, numerals and dice patterns) and beginning to create and use our own representations of number i.e picture number lines or keeping records of counting with tallies and marks
- Subitising numbers to 5 and beyond, spotting patterns and shapes in representations of number
- We will continue to use talk around shape, space and measure
- Understanding and using (verbally or with picture cards and cues) positional language
- Investigating simple addition and composition of numbers up to 5

Children who attend mainstream classes for Maths will follow the relevant year group's curriculum.
