MATHS

Next half term our Maths learning focus will be:

- Joining in with number and finger rhymes.
- Subitising opportunities through continuous provision and sensory play.
- Touch counting objects in a regular pattern.
- Take turns in dice rolling and simple board games that involve counting.
- Understanding representations of number up to 10, (including Numicon, 10 frames, numerals and dice patterns) and beginning to create and use our own representations of number i.e. picture number lines or keeping records of counting with tallies and marks.
- Subitising numbers to 5 and beyond and spotting patterns and shapes in representations of number.
- We will continue to use talk around shape, space and measure.
- Understanding and using (verbally or with picture cards and cues) positional language.
- Investigating simple addition, subtraction and composition of numbers up to 10 (including doubling).

Children who attend mainstream classes for Maths will follow the relevant year group's curriculum.

TOPIC

Frozen!

During Spring 1 our Kingfishers will be exploring lots of cold places! We will be learning all about the animals that live in cold climates. We will be going on some imaginary adventures (being sure to wrap up warm!). We will be exploring and learning all about freezing and melting in science, we will be comparing cold and hot places and talking about differences and we will be listening to and responding to stories set in the snow featuring animals that live in the Arctic, Antarctic and other snowy places.

Next half term our English learning focus will be:

- Using colourful semantics to talk about story moments.

- Developing listening skills for rhythm and rhyme as well as sight vocabulary reading of common functional, CVC words and short sentences.
- Investigating alliteration and initial sounds in words.
