

## ENGLISH

Reading will remain a focus for the summer term and children will be encouraged to change their books regularly. Our lessons will continue to develop the skills of retrieval, inference and word meaning.

During writing lessons, we will be focusing on the key skills of using capital letters and full stops within all our sentences and will be writing instructions about how to make pizzas. We will also be writing a recount about our trip to Iron Bridge and will be writing a non-chronological report all about Florence Nightingale.

## PSHE

### Relationships

During this half term, we will be discussing families, how to deal with friends and conflict, learning about secrets and celebrating special relationships within our lives.

## Design & Technology

### Perfect Pizzas

We will start by discussing our favourite pizzas as a class before moving onto examining, describing and categorising a variety of bread-based products and toppings. We will finish the unit by designing, making, eating and evaluating our own pizza.



## MATHS

This half term during our maths lessons we will revisit how to find fractions of both shapes and amounts. Children will find, name and write the fractions before moving on to solving word problems involving fractions.

We will then explore estimation, where children will make a good guess based on what we already know. Finally, we will look at time. We will use the mini clocks to help us read the time practically before learning how to read and write the time to the hour, the half hour, 15-minute intervals and 5-minute intervals.

## RE

### What is the good news that Jesus brings?

Children will investigate the lives of some people for whom Jesus was the 'good news'. Jesus offered friendship, forgiveness and peace to everyone he met, and the children will think about how these three offerings are 'good news'.
