Trackit Lights – Behaviour

It's Good to be Green



- Trackit Lights is a behaviour monitoring system that rewards children for making positive choices whilst identifying and supporting children who choose not to. It is a positive approach towards good discipline throughout school to promote high expectations
- Children will earn Golden Time throughout the week
- Children will also earn prizes at the end of each term based on their behaviour score
- Each day will end with Reflection Time – we discuss the day (restorative practice)
- Pupils will receive warnings and warning lights (if necessary) to encourage them to make positive choices

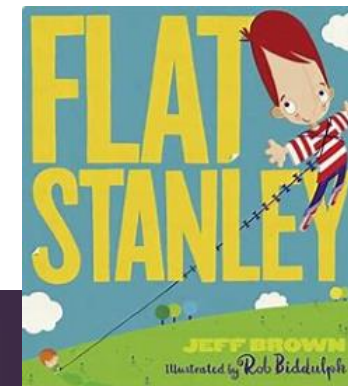
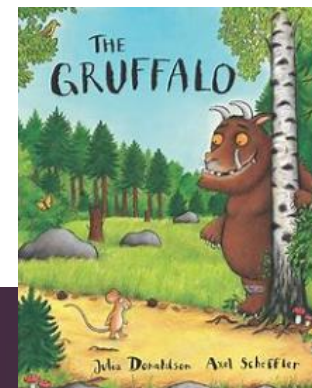
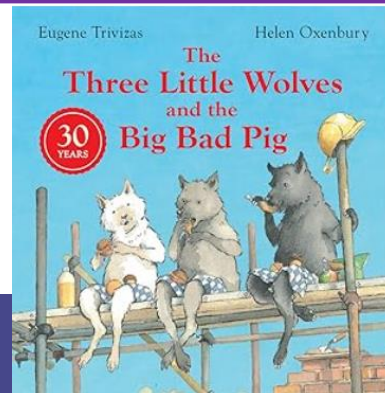
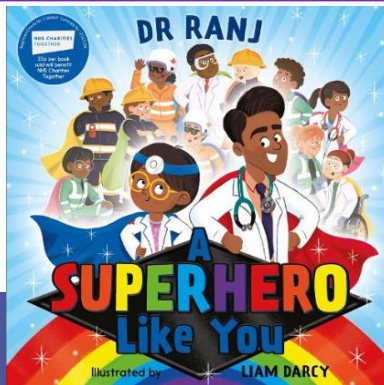
Reading and Writing



English

- Demonstrating interest in a selection of reading material through exploration and sensory experiences.
 - Joining in with familiar songs and stories.
 - Improving speaking and listening skills through social interaction, small group interventions and one to one speech and language support.
 - Our older students will be using aids to develop language and vocabulary.
 - Our younger students will be developing their listening skills for rhythm and rhyme as well as sight vocabulary, reading of common functional, CVC words and short sentences.
- Children who attend mainstream classes for English will follow the relevant year group's curriculum.

Physical Education (PE)

Children will have PE lessons each week.

Our PE days are Thursdays (KF2) and Friday (KF1).

Children must come to school in their PE kit on these days.
All jewellery must be removed at home for P.E. lessons.
Staff are not permitted to remove earrings.



PE will be taught by Mr Johns.

If your child takes part in PE with their mainstream class, we will let you know which day so that they can come in their PE kit.

Our School Uniform

All children are expected to wear school uniform.

- Pale blue polo shirt
- Royal blue sweatshirt or cardigan
- Mid-grey trousers, grey skirt or pinafore dress
- Black, grey or white socks
- Blue and white check dress (optional summertime)
- Black flat shoes
- PE Kit- blue shorts, pale blue t-shirt, navy hoodie and black pumps

Jewellery is not advisable and should be limited to one pair of small stud earrings. These will need to be removed at home on PE days.

Please note that staff are not permitted to remove earrings.

Please make sure all items of uniform, particularly sweatshirts, P.E kits and coats are named so that mislaid items can be easily reunited with their owner!





Forest Schools



- Our Forest Schools Day is Thursday.
- Children will need wellies and coats.
- This is our chance to get outside and explore, as well as take part in activities that encourage managed risk.



Snacks and drinks



Every morning, your child can choose to have a piece of buttered bagel on their arrival.

At morning break, children are given the option to have some fruit/vegetables and/or a piece of buttered bagel. There is no cost for this. Alternatively, they can bring in their own healthy snack from home such as a piece of fruit or a cereal bar.

Your child should also bring in a named water bottle each day.



Lunchtimes

Children in KS1 are to a free school meal every day.

There is always a hot meal and vegetarian option, or children can choose a sandwich or a jacket potato.

If you prefer, you can provide your child with a packed lunch from home. Please use a lunch box that is clearly labelled with your child's name. Drinks should be still (not fizzy) and stored in either a carton or plastic bottle.

Children will be offered water or milk with their lunchtime meal either way.





Assessments



We will continue to use IASend to track children's progress.

We will also track and monitor children's EHCP targets through our SEND plans. (Termly meetings with parents)



Home school links



Class Newsletters are sent out each half term so that you hear about what your child will be learning.

Book bags are sent home at the end of the week. Each bag contain:



- A library book to share.
- Information about the stories we are sharing in school, with a prompt sheet.

These will help you develop your child's love of reading.

- Where a task will support the children, staff may send home an activity to be shared with parents.

We value the contribution parents can make to their child's education and know that children make better progress when we work in partnership with you. We will be organising various events through the year which we hope you will join us for.

Parent Consultations

Parents' Evenings are held at regular intervals throughout the school year. You will be given the opportunity at the meeting to discuss your child's progress with Miss Kick and Mr Jee. If you do need to discuss your child with us at any other time, Staff are available at drop off and collection times.



Homework (Hybrid)



Each child will be provided with a homework login card.

Homework will be set online every Friday. We kindly ask that work is completed by the following Wednesday.

Your child will be asked to complete:

- Spelling practice (linked to the curriculum for this year group) - this will be set on Spelling Shed.
- Maths TT practise – this will link to the taught tables (and give opportunities to review previously taught table facts) - this will be set on TT Rockstars



Reminders



Doors are open from 8:45. They will be staffed from 8:45 - 8:55am in the morning. A member of staff from our class will always be available to speak to every day.

School will finish at 3- 3:15pm.

Please remember to label all your child's belongings with their name.

Please remember to send your child in with their water bottle daily.

PE is on Thursday (KF2) and Friday (KF1).
